The U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in March released its <u>latest traffic crash data</u>, which found 38,824 people in 2020 lost their lives in accidents nationwide -- the highest number of fatalities since 2007.

Year-over-year, the rate of fatal crashes increased by nearly 7%, and in 45% of those crashes, drivers were engaged in risky driving behavior, according to the DOT.

CarInsurance.com examined the most dangerous behaviors and rates these six as the riskiest:

- 1. **Drunk driving** Alcohol, even in small amounts, can affect reaction time
- 2. **Drug-impaired driving**—In a study, more than 50% of drivers involved in serious injury and fatal crashes tested positive for at least one drug
- 3. **Distracted driving**—Drivers are distracted by more than just cell phones and hand-held devices
- 4. **Not using a seatbelt**—Buckling up is considered the single most important precaution to take to avoid injury, or death, in an accident
- 5. **Speeding**—This type of aggressive driving is on the rise
- 6. **Drowsy driving**—Accidents involving falling asleep at the wheel most frequently occur between midnight and 6 a.m., or in the late afternoon

"Driving is so woven into our daily lives that it can be easy to forget how dangerous it can be," says John McCormick, editorial director for Carlnsurance.com. "Taking a closer look at the riskiest behaviors involved with driving can remind us of the importance of avoiding these behaviors."
